



Evidence Based Clinical Practice




Growth of studies in PubMed

Our mission is to promote evidence-informed health decision-making by producing high-quality, relevant, accessible systematic reviews and other synthesized research evidence.





Who is Cochrane?

- Global independent network of researchers, professionals, patients, carers, and people interested in health.
- Cochrane contributors (37,000 from more than 130 countries) work together to produce credible, accessible health information that is free from commercial sponsorship and other conflicts of interest.
- Cochrane work is recognised as representing an international gold standard for high quality, trusted information.

- PRM is a Dimension of Health whose interests inside Cochrane should be promoted and represented

Aim

- Cochrane Rehabilitation is aimed to ensure that all rehabilitation professionals can apply Evidence Based Clinical Practice,
- combining the best available evidence as gathered by high quality Cochrane systematic reviews,
- with their own clinical expertise and the values of patients



Objectives

- to identify and systematically spread the best available PRM evidence (Cochrane reviews)
- to conduct and disseminate PRM "overviews of reviews"
- to focus on relevant PRM topics not yet covered by Cochrane
- to improve research methodology in PRM
- to increase visibility of EBM activities relevant to PRM and of PRM in other fields of medicine



Six Goals

- 1. Connect stakeholders and individuals involved in evidence based rehabilitation practice, creating a global network
- 2. Undertake knowledge translation for Cochrane on reviews relevant to rehabilitation, with dissemination to stakeholders
- 3. Develop a register of (non-)Cochrane systematic reviews relevant to rehabilitation
- Promote evidence based clinical practice and provide education and training
- Strengthen evidence based clinical practice methodology to inform rehabilitation and stimulating methodological developments in other Cochrane groups
- 6. Promote and advocate for evidence-based rehabilitation to other Cochrane groups and wider rehabilitation stakeholders
